CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

OLD TESTAMENT READING: ZECHARIAH 9:9-10

R: A reading from the Prophet Zechariah, the 9th Chapter.

Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

He will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war-horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth.

R: A reading from Paul's Letter to the Philippians, the 2nd Chapter.

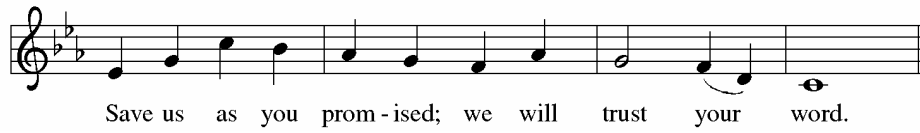
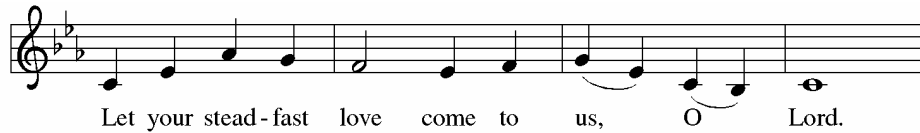
⁵Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, ⁶who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, ⁷but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, ⁸he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death — even death on a cross.

⁹Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.'" ³²So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. ³³As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" ³⁴They said, "The Lord needs it." Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!" Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."

Come, Jesus, King and Savior, into our hearts, we pray.



P: On this day we praise God for all Jesus did in his last week on earth: for his preferring service to rule, for his weeping over Jerusalem, for his love in the face of mortal enemies.

C: May we serve, mourn, love, and follow Jesus to the cross.

P: We give thanks for Jesus' gift of his last supper on the night he was betrayed, for the bread and wine that are his body and blood, and for his forgiveness even while dying in agony.

C: May we remember his suffering and death and accept the greatest gift he gives to us: his very self.

P: We commend to God the services of worship we have planned for Holy Week. May this week be for us an opportunity to re-examine our priorities and to move into costlier discipleship. May the Spirit reshape us and draw us into Jesus' story.

C: May we know God's boundless love and mercy through Jesus' suffering and death. Amen.
