Sermon

Confession / Forgiveness:

- L: O Lord, when your desert people cried out to you in hunger, you gave them bread from heaven and brought out water from the rock. When the needy seek sustenance and there is none, when your creatures suffer, when their tongues are parched with thirst, you answer them: "I, the God of Israel, will not forsake you!"
- C: We too, hungry and thirsty for righteousness, cry out, "Do not forsake us!"**
- L: But your answer comes, confounding and convicting: "Do not forsake me!" you say.
- C: "You, Lord?" we respond. "When did we see you?"**
- L: Then you reveal yourself in the suffering of our neighbor and in the cries of your creation. Free us from greed, apathy, and a casual life of convenience without concern. Make us see the connection between our every action in daily life and the health of your world. Bring righteousness from our hearts like water from a rock, that our neighbors in all creation may know healing and wholeness.
- C: Forgive our sins Lord, and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.**
- L: In the mercy of God, who gave Jesus Christ to die for us and for the whole creation, you are loved as abundantly as God provides rain for the fields. Sisters and brothers, in Christ your sins are forgiven, and you are made new to live in right and good relationship with God and with all that God has made.
- C: Amen!**

Reading: Revelation 22:1-2

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month, and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

Remembrance of Baptism

L: By water and the Word, God claims us as daughters and sons and promises forgiveness, life, and salvation. In Christ, a river of life flows through the middle of our dry hearts, through the middle of our cities, through all that is distorted and polluted in the world that God made good. In Christ, we are promised a tree of life for the healing of the nations and for the healing of all creation.
