INTRODUCTION

‡ LITANY OF BAPTISM

- L: In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. A beautiful generative darkness was over the surface of the deep, and chaos was everywhere.
- C: And the Spirit of God hovered over the waters.
- L: Adom the earth creature was created with and for love. Adom asked "God, what is all of this?" God said to Adom, "Whatever you call it, Adom. That will be its name." This (along with the temptation to be God) began the death dealing labeling system that we now know today as "white supremacy" that remains in the water that we swim in on a daily basis.
- C: And the Spirit of God hovered over the waters.
- L: If we say we have not participated in this system we deceive ourselves and the truth isn't in us, but if we confess our participation in harmful systems, God is faithful and just and will forgive us. With the waters of racism pouring on us in every sector of society, the question is not whether we are wet, but how.
- C: And the Spirit of God hovered over the waters.

- L: For the same Spirit that hovered over the waters of creation, also hovers over the waters of baptism. It is in those waters that God reminds us that we are beloved. It is in these waters that we remember that God's mercies are new every morning. Every workshop. Every post. Every tweet. Every conversation.
- C: And the Spirit of God hovered over the waters.
- L: So, today, allow these waters to wash away every untrue label that you have received. Let these waters wash away every ounce of shame that you have carried with you about doing anti-racism work poorly. Let these waters become the waters of justice that roll down like mighty waters and lead us all to God's new city of peace.
- C: And God looked at all that God had created and called it "good."

- P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

‡ PRAYER OF THE DAY

- P: Let us pray.
- C: O God, you give us your Son as the vine apart from whom we cannot live. Nourish our life in his resurrection, that we may bear the fruit of love and know the fullness of your joy, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

READING: ACTS 8:26-40

Led by the Spirit, Philip encounters an Ethiopian official who is returning to his African home after having been to Jerusalem to worship. Philip uses their encounter to proclaim the gospel to him. Upon coming to faith in Jesus, he is baptized by Philip.

R: A reading from the book of Acts, the 8th Chapter.

²⁶ Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷ So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, the queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship ²⁸ and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. ²⁹ Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." ³⁰ So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" ³¹ He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. ³² Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

"Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth.

33 In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth."

³⁴ The eunuch asked Philip, "About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" ³⁵ Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. ³⁶ As they were going along the road, they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?" ³⁸ He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. ³⁹ When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more and went on his way rejoicing. ⁴⁰ But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

R: The word of the Lord.

‡ GOSPEL: JOHN 15:1-8

On the night of his arrest, Jesus taught his disciples about the relationship they would have with him. Those who abide in his word and love bear fruit, for apart from him, they can do nothing.

R: The holy gospel according to St. John, the 15th Chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

¹"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. ² He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. ³ You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴ Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵ I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷ If you abide in me and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.


